

⊖ Check Browser Compatibility

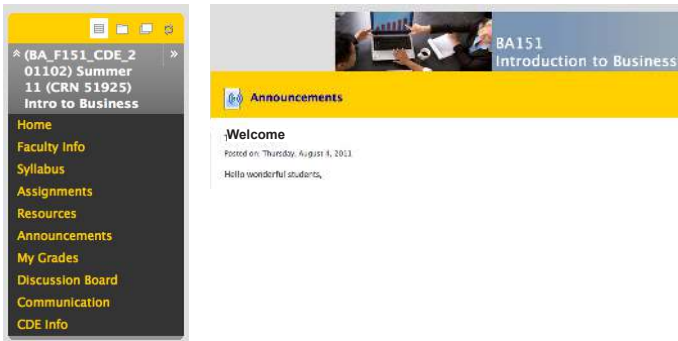
Go to <http://classes.alaska.edu> and your browser will automatically be evaluated for compatibility. If your browser isn't compatible, follow the directions.

⊖ Tests & Quizzes

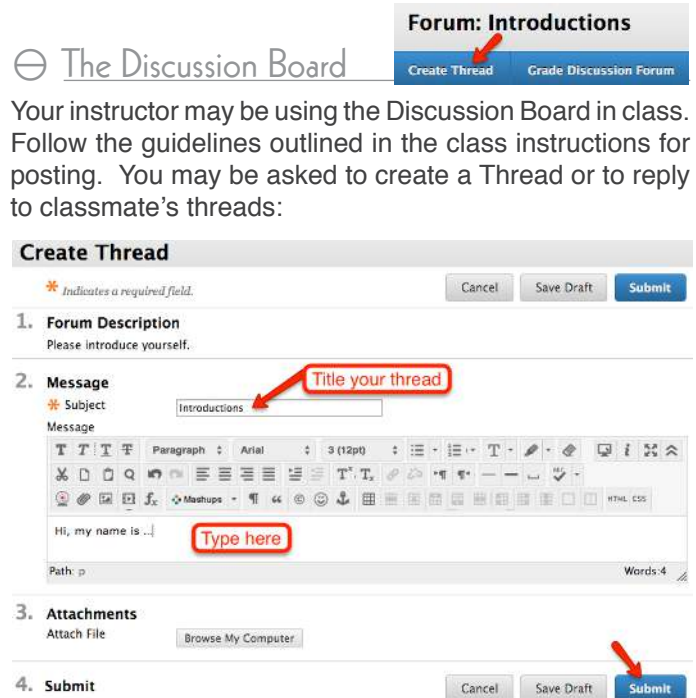

⊖ Proctored Exams

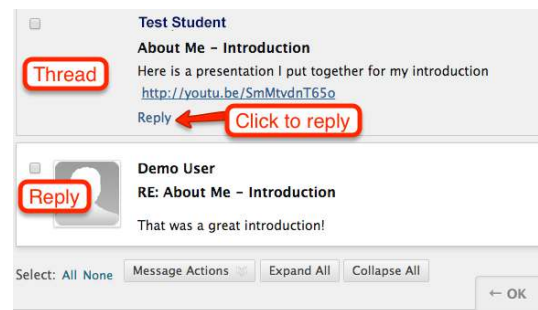
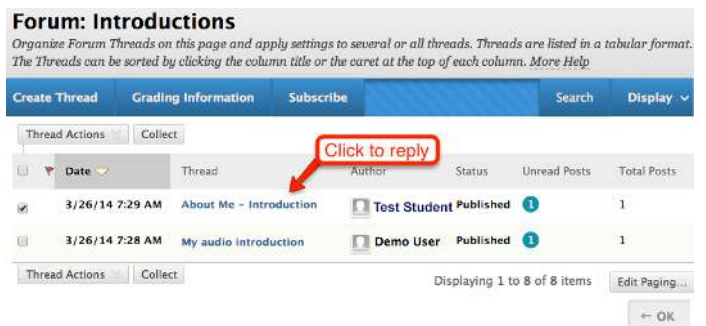
